The popular Read-A-Thon's goal is to encourage children to have fun reading while raising money for the Wilton Education Foundation – that means all proceeds benefit our public schools.



This family-friendly event puts talented students and adult musicians on stage to showcase and develop their talents while performing cover tunes and original songs for the community. This collection of performers plays a variety of music, all to raise money for local causes.



Held on Memorial Day weekend, this chip-timed race attracts everyone from strollers to casual joggers, serious runners to marathoners, all excited to be a part of this superb community-wide event. ### wef fundraising programs

These programs are designed to give individuals, families and corporate sponsors the ability to make an impact on the community in personal ways.

#### commemorative bricks

This program gives everyone in the community the opportunity to create a lasting impression for a special someone or group by purchasing a personalized brick. These custom bricks adorn the walkways at the entrance of every Wilton public school. # what we've accomplished together

Funds raised from events and programs have helped us keep Wilton schools equipped with the latest, state-of-the-art technology, enrich students' lives through music and the arts, and invest in the development for our educators.



### wef recording studio

A group of enthusiastic Wilton High School students have come together to create a professional grade recording studio in an unused space at the high school. The WEF Board voted to grant \$35,000 toward the project, asking the students to continue their active fundraising effort to raise the remainder of the \$46,000 estimated total cost.

#### middlebrook greenhouse

WEF recently donated \$40,000 toward the construction of a state-of-the-art greenhouse to be located at Middlebrook School to support a farm-to-table initiative as part of the Home & Careers curriculum. This initiative will provide students with an opportunity to grow plants and vegetables and learn the science and business of horticulture.

#### professional development
